The Anointing

1 John 2:27 "But the anointing which ye have received of him abideth in you, and ye need not that any man teach you: but as the same anointing teacheth you of all things, and is truth, and is no lie, and even as it hath taught you, ye shall abide in him."

To understand more of "the anointing" of God is to understand more of the purpose and power of God. The challenge we have in understanding this word today is looking past it's common use. In our day, the word is tossed around to overly spiritualize people or things. "Anointing" cars, houses, or even people "anointed" to do, quite frankly, things that God has never commissioned — all shroud the true meaning and purpose of God's Anointing. Let's not miss the blessedness there is in understanding the anointing of God.

We let Scripture define Scripture, comparing spiritual things with spiritual. There is a principle when understanding the Bible: the Principle of First Mention. The first time a word is used in the scripture can provide good insight as to what that word properly means. Genesis 31:13 "I am the God of Bethel, where thou anointedst the pillar, and where thou vowedst a vow unto me: now arise, get thee out from this land, and return unto the land of thy kindred." This is the first use of this word "anointing" in the Bible, calling back to the previous instance of Jacob anointing the rock at Bethel. Genesis 28:10-11, 16-22 "And Jacob went out from Beersheba, and went toward Haran. [11] And he lighted upon a certain place, and tarried there all night, because the sun was set; and he took of the stones of that place, and put them for his pillows, and lay down in that place to sleep... [16] And Jacob awakened out of his sleep, and he said, Surely the LORD is in this place; and I knew it not. [17] And he was afraid, and said, How dreadful is this place! this is none other but the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven. [18] And Jacob rose up early in the morning, and took the stone that he had put for his pillows, and set it up for a pillar, and poured oil upon the top of it. [19] And he called the name of that place Bethel: but the name of that city was called Luz at the first. [20] And Jacob vowed a vow, saying, If God will be with me, and will keep me in this way that I go, and will give me bread to eat, and raiment to put on, [21] So that I come again to my father's house in peace; then shall the LORD be my God: [22] And this stone, which I have set for a pillar, shall be God's house: and of all that thou shalt give me I will surely give the tenth unto thee." Jacob anointed (poured oil over) the rock to hallow it as God's House. What was before a heap of rocks was now separated and reverenced as the House of God. This evidently was the case, because God himself called what was formerly known as Luz, "Bethel" – the House of God.

We then go on to see the word "anointing" used in the separation of the sons of Aaron into the Priest's Office. Exodus 28:40-41 "And for Aaron's sons thou shalt make coats, and thou shalt make for them girdles, and bonnets shalt thou make for them, for glory and for beauty. [41] And thou shalt put them upon Aaron thy brother, and his sons with him; and shalt anoint them, and consecrate them, and sanctify them, that they may minister unto me in the priest's office." The purpose of the anointing was to set them apart into God's established role as Priest. Only those who were anointed could serve as a Priest. Exodus 29:1, 7-9 "And this is the thing that thou shalt do unto them to hallow them, to minister unto me in the priest's office... Then thou shalt take the anointing oil, and pour it upon his head, and anoint him. [8] And thou shalt bring his sons, and put coats upon them. [9] And thou shalt gird them with girdles, Aaron and his sons, and put the bonnets on them: and the priest's office shall be theirs for a perpetual statute: and thou shalt consecrate Aaron and his sons." The anointed priest was hallowed, or "set apart", from all the other people. Why was this? Not to make them glow before men, or themselves be worshipped, but that they might serve God in the capacity that He desired.

In days past, God used oil to represent the Spirit of God – As "...Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him... the Spirt of the LORD came upon David from that day forward..." (1 Samuel 16:13). Truly, it is not a mixture of earthly substance itself that separates a pillar of stones to become the House of God, but "...the tabernacle shall be sanctified by my glory." (Exodus 29:43). What is God's glory? What is this anointing? Jesus Christ is "the glory" of God's people! Jesus Christ is "the brightness of his glory"! (see Luke 2:32 and Hebrews 1:3). Jesus Christ is "the anointing which ye have received of him" that "abideth in you" (1 John 2:27). "The Anointing" is not some mysterious force imposed upon an individual, but Jesus Christ himself. Jesus Christ is the Anointing that takes a people that were not a people and separates them as the house of God. Jesus Christ is the Anointing that empowers us, His Household, to be the only bridge between God and man (the Royal Priesthood). It is the Anointing, Jesus Christ, that separates us from the rest of this world. It is not any natural success, nor our many talents (or lack thereof), but it is the Spirit of God dwelling in us, no more and no less, that makes us different from a dying and depraved world.

As for our focus verse... The Spirit of Christ which "ye" have received – plural – that is, the Church. The Church has no need that a man, who is without the anointing, teach us (1 John 2:27). It is Jesus Christ, the anointing Himself, who provides "The words of the wise", which are "as nails". The Anointing is building the House of God, nail by nail, through the wise Pastors. Though there be many Pastors in God's sheepfold, the words of the wise are given from "one shepherd" and therefore that One Shepherd "shall bear the glory" (see Ecclesiastes 12:11 and Zechariah 6:13).

It is a tragedy that people become so focused on faking spiritual, that they overlook what God has truly given us. The Anointing isn't simply a "thing" – used to make someone or something special. Nor does it mean that one walks around on "cloud-nine", looking down at mere "less-anointed" mortals. Let's not overlook the True Anointing – Jesus Christ working in us to be His House. What a pleasure and blessedness it truly is to have the Anointing within us!
